Day 11 The Go Outside Challenge (Otherwise known as Digital Detox)

Make a plan to get your family outside –with no screens! What activites can you plan to make this achievable?



 Go outside – one hour every day (walk the dog, swim at the beach, skate park...) Start small – this one is my most challenging! I sometimes aim for 5 minutes in the garden, eat lunch outside, bring the bins in, hang out the washing and walk to the letterbox!

2. One day (or half day) every week (picnics, longer walks, bike rides...) For us – it's Surfing lessons and Sunday afternoon at the beach.

 Spend consecutive days (a week of you can) once a year (camping, Simply Homeschool Camps link) We go camping – I aim for 3 times per year – Katoomba Easter Convention, Simply Homeschool Wangat Camp, and our own family week.

Day 12 Passion & Future...

Identifying Passion

What are your child's current passions? (Chickens, kites, dancing, surfing, fishing, horses, Minecraft, guitar, piano, art, Lego, slime, reading, audiobooks, puzzles, sewing, photography...)



Encouraging Passion

If they are healthy passions – how can you encourage them and provide opportunity for them to develop these passions? (Resources, lessons, time to take them somewhere, active involvement...)

Igniting Passion

Often our children become passionate when provided with new opportunities. What new opportunities can you provide for your child this year? Core Programs and excursions can ignite passions – my daughter's latest passion is Illuminated Letters ignited by a Core Program and a set of metallic markers.

Curbing Unhealthy Passion

Sometimes our children have unhealthy passions – such as too much gaming! This is a challenging part of parenting and sometimes takes some tough boundaries. I'm no expert. Write your thoughts about your child's passions. If you need support to parent these challenges well, consider who you might contact for support.


